Barbara Northrop will teach you tips on organizing your genealogy research as you collect information.



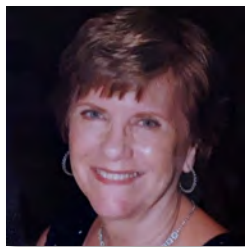
Tuesday, September 21, 10:30-12:00 Noon, Genealogy Jargon

Warren Harry Brown

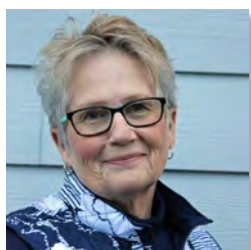
October 1, 1934 - July 8, 2021



Warren H. Brown, 86, passed away peacefully at his home on the Butte Falls Hwy on July 8, 2021, after a long battle with cancer. Warren was born October 1, 1934, in York, Nebraska to Francis Lee Brown and Florence Catherine Wurtz. He graduated from Butte Falls High School in 1952. Warren

worked for the Medford Corporation (Medco) in the woods as a Cat Skinner for 39 years from 1952 to 1991. He served in the U.S. Army from 1956-1958 and was stationed in Korea for 16 months until he was honorably discharged. Warren married Charleen

Marie (Ferguson) Jolliffe on October 1, 1960, in Reno, NV. Together they celebrated 60 anniversaries and were the epitome of true love. Their devotion to one another was an inspiration to many. In his spare time, Warren enjoyed woodworking, dancing, playing pinochle, puzzles, and watching cowboy shows. Warren was a true handyman who could build or fix just about anything. His home was always filled with custom built bookshelves, small furniture, and various carvings that he crafted. Many family members and friends have one of his hand carved chains or custom wooden ornaments. Over his lifetime he single-handedly completed multiple big remodeling projects on the various properties he owned as well as volunteered numerous hours building and installing the wooden bookshelves that fill the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society in Medford. Warren was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers Robert Lee Brown, Donald Eugene Brown, William Dean Brown, and two sisters Dorothea Ann Oxford and Florence Catherine Stites. Warren is survived by his wife, six children Vicki Green, Nancy Pollard, Jeffrey Brown, Christina Beams, Craig Brown, Shayna Brown, 15 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren, two sisters Betty Lou Richman, Doloris Mae Hale, one brother Jerry Dale Brown, and many nieces and nephews. Warren was one of the kindest people you could ever meet who never had a negative thing to say about anyone or anything. He had a wonderful sense of humor and always greeted everyone with a big smile. Warren was a truly great man and an inspiration to many. He will be missed. Currently, the Family History Library is open Monday through Friday, 9 AM until 5 PM. They are taking special safety protocols, following the latest government guidelines. The workstations have more spacing between each one and are regularly sanitized. The library has rearranged the layout for safety and better research flow. The number of large scanners has tripled and are strategically placed for ease of use. Photocopies are now free. Lighting has been improved throughout the facility. Even the break room has been expanded and rest rooms remodeled for researcher's comfort.

The most exciting reason to join us in Salt Lake though is that the library is adding about 50,000 new books to their already extensive collection.

Our set of CDs is part of a collection of the original 23,000 FGSs and a list of 365,000 surnames with vital data contributed by people all across the USA. They are old and that is good.

* The big white binder with *10-cent Tips* is on the table next to the printer. Read the contents. Scan or copy the items you find useful for 10 cents per page. Contribute your ideas for research, sources,

articles, etc. to this binder which was started by Carolyn Beron and kept current by RVGS members for all to use.

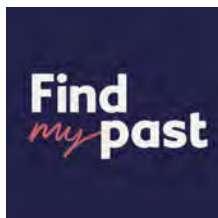

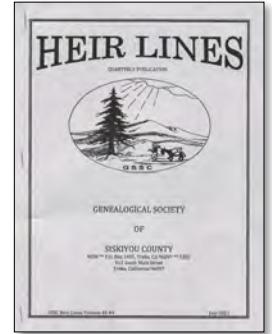
