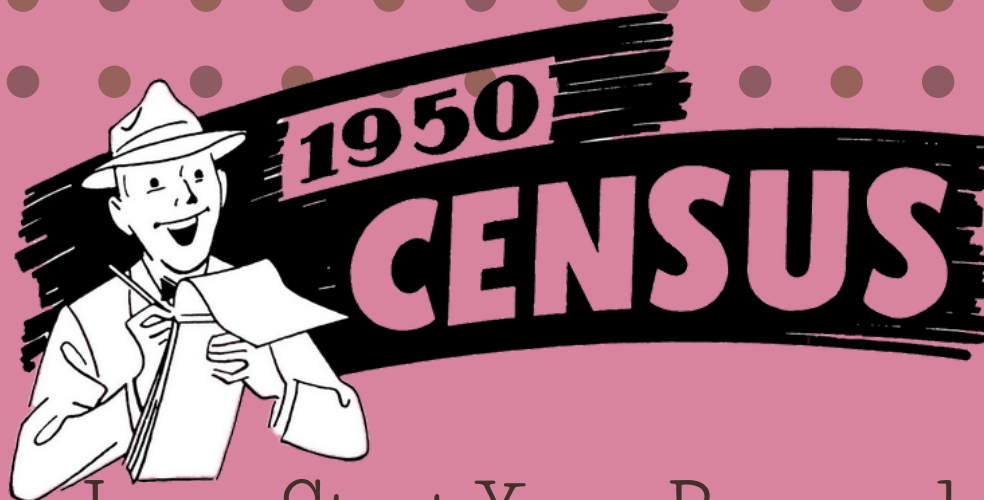

The 1950 Census: Jump Start Your Research

The Census Bureau will release the 1950 census data sheets on April 1, 2022. Personal name indexing may not be available right away. You can jump start your research by creating geographical parameters and using census maps, newspapers and city directories.

The Non-Population Schedules: Use Every Census Product

As valuable as they are, there's so much more to the censuses than the population schedules. The Agricultural, Mortality, Manufacturing/Industry, Social Statistics, and Slave schedules, give you data to fill out the biographies and lives of the people and places you research.

Pulling Evidence from the Pre-1850 Censuses

The first census which names everyone, not just the head of household, is the 1850. Before 1850 other family members are shown only as tick marks. Don't overlook the data you can pull from those six census schedules. By comparing several pre-1850 censuses, you can follow individuals through time and infer their ages and in many cases their identities.
