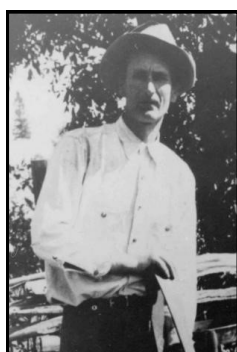

## Free Vital Record Copies Available for Oregon Fire Victims



If you know anyone affected by Oregon's devastating wildfires, let them know the state will give them free duplicate copies of vital records.

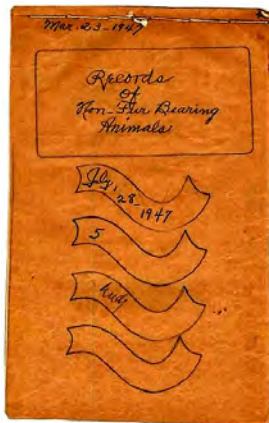
The State Vital Records office "will provide up to three (3) certified copies of a birth, death, marriage, divorce, domestic partnership or dissolution of domestic partnership free of charge if the record is requested in connection with Executive Order 20-35 related to wildfire response."

This applies only to fires in Oregon. The waiver of fees lasts until March 1, 2021. Full details are online [here](#).

## Heirloom Genealogy: Case Studies, George Wright's Life, Family, Philosophy and Notebooks"

George Wright was born in 1896 in the mountains northeast of Hornbrook, California. At the age of 14



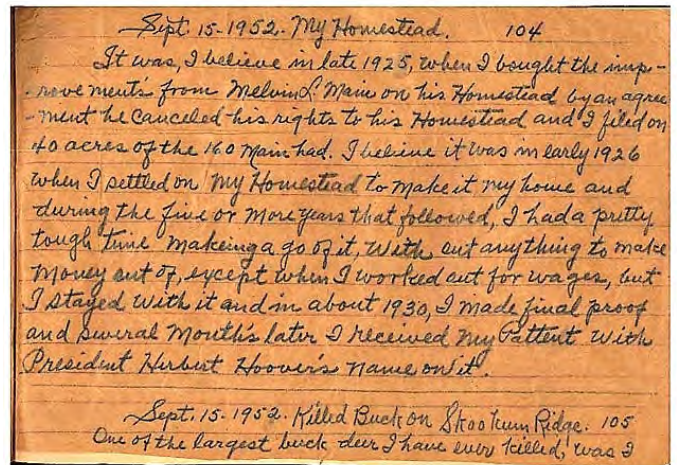
he left the family home and traveled up into the Soda Mountain Wilderness Area where he spent his life riding horses, raising livestock, hunting, spending time with friends, and writing. Wright filled hundreds of brown-paper, hand-stitched notebooks with his memories and his thoughts on many subjects. One story shares the

history of Reelfoot the very large black bear that roamed the wild canyon region of the Siskiyou Mountains in the neighborhood of Pilot Rock for over twenty years. George's Uncle William and a friend killed Reelfoot in 1890 and had him stuffed. For years, Reelfoot was exhibited around the



country. ([Click here](#) to read more about Reelfoot.) Wright's very readable words provide a valuable legacy on life in Southern Oregon.

### Ancestry Record Spotlight

Fort Smith, Arkansas, Criminal Case Files, 1866-1900

In the course of your research, have you unearthed a newspaper article detailing a crime committed by or against your ancestor in Arkansas or the Indian Territory during the late 19th century? There's a possibility that the case was prosecuted in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Arkansas, Fort Smith Division. If you're a student of the Wild West, you may already be familiar with Judge Isaac Parker, the presiding jurist appointed by President Grant in 1875 and famously known as the "hanging



judge” due to the number of convicts he sentenced to death. The good news is that the case files held by the National Archives (Fort Worth) are available for viewing on Ancestry!

If your research subject was charged with a crime, you can search for their case by going directly to “Fort Smith, Arkansas, Criminal Case Files, 1866-1900” in Ancestry and search by their name. The search result will provide a Jacket Number and link to view the images of the loose paper documents in the Defendant Jacket. Also, be sure to browse the other collection title in the database: Criminal Record Transcripts. Some cases have additional scanned court transcripts available, browsable by the defendant name.

If your research subject was a victim of a crime, NARA (Fort Worth) offers a “Fort Smith Victim Index” in their Research Guide here: <https://bit.ly/2FCemp6>. Once you locate the victim’s name, you’ll then have the defendant name, charge, year of crime and the jacket number, which can be used to locate the files on Ancestry.

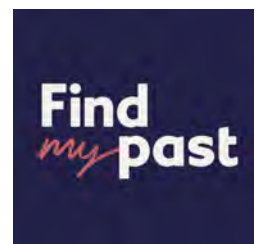

She provides chapter by chapter guidance in developing a research plan and includes the steps that will lead you to success...or at least to a thorough attempt to break through a brick wall. She includes templates for forms she recommends, several in-depth work samples so you can see how the process really works, excellent internet site suggestions and sources, all without overwhelming you. 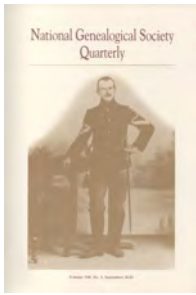

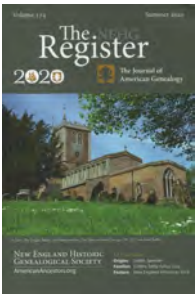
